



Where on Earth is Fredonia?



Fredonia, Kansas



- Wichita 80 miles (1 ½ hours)
- Kansas City 120 miles (2 hours)
- Joplin 90 miles $(1 \frac{3}{4} \text{ hours})$
- Tulsa 110 miles (2 hours)
- Denver, Colorado 600 miles (9 hours)
- Mexico City, Mexico -- 1500 miles (1 ½ days)

What does it mean to be "rural?"

- Approximately 21% of the U.S. population lives in rural areas
- But rural physicians comprise only about 10 % of the total number of working physicians in the country
- Research shows a reasonable physician to population ration is 1:1200
- In rural areas, the ratio is closer to 1:2000-3000



- 25-Bed Critical Access Hospital
 - Located in a rural area
 - Have emergency care services24-hours a day, 7 days a week
 - Maintain no more than 25 inpatient beds
 - Have an annual average length of stay of 96 hours or less per patient for acute care.

- 5 Physicians
- Services on-site
 - o Inpatient Care
 - Emergency Department / EMS
 - Physical Therapy
 - Respiratory Therapy
 - Outpatient services
 - o Lab
 - Radiology
 - Surgery

Father-Daughter Surgery



- Observation
- Acute / Inpatient
- Swing bed
 - o Provide skilled nursing care.
 - Has CMS approval to provide post-hospital SNF care and meets certain requirements.
 - Medicare Part A (the hospital insurance program) covers post-hospital extended care services furnished in a swing bed hospital.

- Monthly Specialty Clinics
 - o 2 Cardiologists
 - o Orthopedic Surgeon
 - o Urologist
 - o OB/Gyn
 - o Podiatry


