The 2006 Board of Directors of the UERMMMC Medical Alumni Association Incorporated has embarked on the following thrusts for this year:

#### Adopt a Project Program

We believe there are many alumni who are supportive of our beloved alma mater. They just do not know the process of how to go about it. We have to make it easy for them to do something for the Medical Center. Each unit in the Medical Center has available plans for priority projects. The association will collate these projects and disseminate information about them so that any medical graduate or any group or, on a larger scale, the batch can choose a project which suits them. #### Build up the Association

The Board has set up an Alumni Endowment Fund. Henceforth, all lifetime membership payments will go to this account. Only the interest earnings of this fund can be disbursed. This will go a long way in building up the association funds and eventually make it more stable financially.

mains of mostly young teen-age victims in March 1996. We saw her then, singly poring over the burned out disco, inspecting, examining and helping provide answers to the hundreds of grieving relatives as to who the remains are. This was just the beginning of her career as the premier forensic pathologist of the country. Her work has carried her to many countries functioning as consultant forensic pathologist or as medical examiner in various crimes, air crashes or other man-made disasters like the Asian Spirit crash in December 1999, the Payatas Disaster in July 2000 and in East Timor. Her expertise is highly regarded and sought after, and she has delivered many a talk and lecture here and abroad.

Her first major award was in 1996 given by the UP Alumni Association, the UP College of Medicine, and the Quezon City government for her assistance in the Ozone Disco fire investigation. That same year, she was given the honor of "Pathologist of the Year Award" by her peers, the Philippine Society of Pathologists. Through the following years, many such awards and citations came to recognize her continuing effort and in 2002, she was given the prestigious "The Outstanding Young Men" (TOYM) Award and the Gerry Roxas Foundation Medal by the Philippine Jaycees, Inc. In 2004, she was given the "The Outstanding Women in the Nation's Sevice (TOWNS)" Award in Medicine. No less than President GMA herself handed over the TOYM and TOWNS awards in Malacañang in both occasions. She has reaped more awards and citations than anyone can remember, but has remained diligently committed to doing more service quietly without fanfare or fancy publicity unlike our headline-grabbing politicos.

So you see, fellow alumni, we are honored by the prestige and distinction that Dra. Racquel Fortun has rightfully earned for herself and for the medical school she graduated from. It is just right that we reciprocate and recognize her valiant efforts in assisting the downtrodden, the victims of crimes and disasters (often man-made), and in her role as Forensic Pathologist par excellance. This award may pale in comparison to the scale of national and international citations she has received, but this is our way of saying that we in UERM are very proud that she's one of us. \*\*

# Alumni CME Conference

The UERMMMC Medical Alumni Association, Inc, UERMMMCAA Inc, and the PMA in Chicago held a Post-Graduate Medical Management Update last February 17, 2006 which was held at the Crowne Plaza Galleria Manila Hotel. The objectives of the conference was as follows: 1. Learn new modes of therapy in the management of cardiovascular diseases including infective endocarditis and hypertension; 2. Recognize patterns of different skin diseases and their new medical and surgical treatments; 3. Learn cost effective work-up of persistent headache; 4. Learn updates on new modes of treatment for inflammatory bowel disease; and 5. Achieve a better understanding of how to avoid human errors in medical care.

Chua, Deputy Chief, Cardiology Division, Southwest Medical Associates Las Vegas, Nevada and Assistant Clinical Professor, University of California School of Medicine at Davis, California, "Cardiology Update 2006: Focus on atrial fibrillation, oral anticoagulants, dyslipedemia, cv biomarkers and antioxidants"; Dr. Ida M. Tiongco, Clinical Associate Professor of Dermatology, Weill Medical College of Cornell University, New York, "Dermatological medical surgical management in the new millennium 2000-2006"; Dr. Joven R. Cuanang, Medical Director, St. Luke's Medical Center, Quezon City, "Cost-effective work-up of persistent headache"; and Dr. Benjamin M. Rigor, Emeritus Professor and Chairman, Dept. of Anesthesiology, School of Medicine, University of Louisville Helath Sciences Center, "Human errors in medicine/medical care".




